Year 11, 2023 Senior Subject Selection Information

During term 3, Year 10 students are learning about senior subjects for Year 11 & 12 and investigating career pathways. Students will use the knowledge and experiences gained throughout the Short Course in Career Education to select Senior School subjects that will progress their career pathway and meet pre-requisites for higher education.

QCE

The Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) is Queensland's senior secondary schooling qualification. It is internationally recognised and provides evidence of senior schooling achievements. All students in Years 11 and 12 at Babinda State School are required to be on a pathway to attain a QCE. All student's QCE progress is monitored throughout year 11 and 12 to ensure they remain QCE eligible. The table below outlines requirements for attaining a QCE.

Set amount 20 credits from contributing courses of study, including:

- QCAA-developed subjects or courses
- vocational education and training (VET) qualifications
- non-Queensland studies
- recognised studies.

Set pattern

12 credits from completed Core courses of study and 8 credits from any combination of:

- Core
- Preparatory (maximum 4)
- Complementary (maximum 8).

Set standard

Satisfactory completion, grade of C or better, competency or qualification completion, pass or equivalent.



Students must meet literacy and numeracy requirements through one of the available learning options.



ATAR

ATAR is the primary mechanism used nationally for tertiary admissions and indicates a student's academic position relative to other students. If you are aiming for an ATAR for tertiary study entry, there are a number of rules that apply. At a minimum, an ATAR is calculated using 4 General + 1 Applied/Certificate III subjects.

At Babinda State School, students aiming for an ATAR choose:

- a. Five General subjects, plus one Applied/Certificate subject (Recommended); OR
- b. Six General subjects
