To have achieved these improvements during our COVID disrupted term is an enormous credit to our whole community.

### Attendance

Of concern is the number of students whose attendance is so poor that they cannot be accurately assessed, and therefore receive an N rating. Students who do not attend school regularly cannot achieve their potential.

As I write to you we have welcomed into our school year six students from across the cluster to have a taste of high school for the first of our transition days. - 3. Accrue 20 credits of academic learning.

### ATAR

Only students looking at entering university are working towards an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR)

To be eligible for an ATAR, a student must:

- complete five General subjects • (Units 3 and 4- year 12); or
- complete four General subjects (Units 3 and 4) plus one Applied subject (at Units 3 and 4) or a VET course at AQF Certificate III level or higher

#### Organise yourself

- Create a study space that is free of distractions and has everything within reach.
- Keep a calendar on your wall and list the dates of your assessments.

- Take regular breaks and move around to keep your mind and body active
- Limit distractions such as social media.

### Organise your work

- Forward planning understand the components of each task and how long they might take.
- Time management make a plan and allow for unexpected events such as technology issues (they will always happen!) or changes in personal circumstances.
- Manage multiple deadlines divide each assessment task into smaller 30-minute tasks (essay plan, essay introduction, essay body, etc.) and slot these into your calendar.


